Summary of Workshop Content: This workshop is a continuation of the **Latin for Language Instructors** series. This workshop will review material covered so far during the series (*Wheelock's Latin*, chapters 1-6) and introduce new material (*Wheelock's Latin*, chapter 7 and 8. This workshop is appropriate for all inlingua instructors.

Expected Learning Outcomes:

During this five-hour workshop, instructors will ...

1. Continue to acquire the vocabulary and grammar of Classical Latin (the literary standard of the Roman Republic and early Roman Empire) at the elementary level.
2. Practice pronouncing Latin as it is believed to have been pronounced during the Classical period; discuss sources of evidence that form the basis of our understanding of how educated native speakers pronounced Latin during the Classical period; and compare and contrast the pronunciation of Classical and Vulgar Latin.
3. Read, analyze and discuss adapted authentic Latin texts that illustrate the target vocabulary and grammatical structures of the lesson while placing those texts in their historical and cultural contexts.
4. Compose short written texts in Latin, review those texts and discuss and analyze the writing process.
5. Learn to identify Latin cognates, roots and affixes (suffixes and prefixes) in English.
6. Better appreciate the educational experiences of adult language learners and empathize with the challenges they face by situating ourselves as learners of a difficult foreign language and then reflect on how these experiences can inform and enhance our teaching practices.
